Defining Sustainability: Sustainability in play-based projects refers to the practice of developing and executing activities and initiatives that meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. It emphasises the creation of play experiences that not only bring joy and learning to participants today but also contribute positively to the environment, community, and society, ensuring long-term benefits and impacts.

In essence, sustainability in play means being mindful of the materials, resources, and practices we use to create play opportunities. It involves considering the environmental, social, and economic impacts of our actions and striving to make choices that are beneficial in the long run.

# Benefits of Sustainability

Integrating sustainability into play-based projects brings numerous benefits:

- Environmental Stewardship: Sustainable play initiatives minimise harm to the environment. This can include using eco-friendly materials, reducing energy consumption, and incorporating green spaces.
- Community Engagement: Sustainability often involves engaging the community in project planning and maintenance. This fosters a sense of ownership and involvement, making play initiatives more successful and enduring.
- Economic Efficiency: Sustainable practices can lead to cost savings. By reducing waste, conserving resources, and using energy-efficient technologies, play projects can be more economically viable.
- Long-term Impact: Sustainability ensures that the benefits of play endure over time. By considering the future consequences of our actions, we create play opportunities that are longer lasting.

# Assessing Sustainability

It is important to reassess our activities and materials with sustainability in mind. Here are a few key tips when considering delivery:

Are my materials renewable?

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What is the lifespan of the materials? Will we get years of use out of them, or will they break or be binned?
Do my actions encourage sustainability and environmental awareness with my community?
Have we tried repurposing or sharing items before making purchases?







## **Case Studies**



Toy Libraries: Allow for extending and reusing the life of toys and play items. Often toys are only used by a single family and then binned after sitting in a cupboard for years. Toy libraries allow for a single toy to be shared between dozens of families, thus greatly reducing waste. Play Plus Toy Library has been operating in Edinburgh for over a decade and has helped support other communities create their own toy sharing initiatives.

**Gallatown Garden and Wild Play space:** Community Garden spaces have been instrumental in championing sustainability in the communities. Gallatown Garden has shown Kirkcaldy that green spaces can offer so much more by connecting adults and children to play, workshops, and learning experiences. From weekly nature play, bike repair workshops, and gardening groups they have turned the outdoors into a community hub and multi-purpose space championing sustainable communities.
